Parish Council News Meeting 4<sup>th</sup> March 2020

The March meeting of the Council took place in Harmer Hill Village Hall on March 4<sup>th</sup>. when much of the meeting was devoted to issues related to road safety.

The Chairman reported that in an attempt to curb speed through Myddle, two new Roadside Data recording VAS units had been purchased and would be erected at sites on Baschurch Road. The units would support the work being carried out by the volunteers running the Community Speed Watch project, who had achieved positive results but were seeking to recruit additional members.

A report from the County Road Safety Officer had indicated that he had secured additional funding and was hoping to proceed with safety measures at the junction of the A528 and Newton Lane and the extension of the 30mph speed limit in Lower Road, Harmer Hill.

In response to continued complaints about pot holes and the condition of many local roads, Shropshire Councillor Brian Williams stated that the employment of a Consultant was already having positive results and a full report would soon be available for distribution to Parishes. Other items considered were reports on the success of the Community Environment Project, where Mr. Marco Busi was carrying out some excellent and well needed improvement work and a review of Shropshire Council's revised Place Plan for the Parish.

It was noted that Shropshire Council had issued an enforcement order on the development which was taking place on land adjacent to Myddle Reservoir and would be progressing this over the next few weeks.
